Caesar possesses that rare ability to achieve, from the moment he steps on stage, a profound emotional interaction with his audience. He touches the listener with the purity of the lyrics, and establishes a beautiful ambiance by sharing with the audience a public show of gratitude to **Nat "King" Cole** for the influence Nat had on him the music industry and the entire world.

A Chicago native and graduate of Southern University, Caesar is considered one of the smoothest baritone vocalists on the music scene today as he effortlessly goes from singing with sparse accompaniment to swinging with the big band and performing with Symphony Orchestra.

Caesar is featured with Nat "King" Cole in the award winning CBS Radio News segment on The Observation Deck by: CBS News Anchor and 3-Time Murrow Award Winner - Dave Barrett. The segment won second place in the 83rd National Headliner Award winners for Broadcast radio networks feature and human-interest story 2017.

Caesar has toured the world with Julio Iglesias and shared the stage with: Herbie Hancock, Al Jarreau, Stanley Clarke, George Duke, Lou Rawls, Deborah Cox, Ronnie Laws, Gerald Albright, Lalah Hathaway Rick Braun and Peter White, just to name a few. Most recently, has been performing his nineteen song Tribute to Nat "King" Cole, with Symphony Orchestras.

Caesar's album has been well received by both jazz and smooth jazz radio programmers around the world, played in rotation with: Harry Connick Jr., Norah Jones, Nat "King" Cole, Barbra Streisand, Miles Davis, Duke Ellington, Frank Sinatra, John Coltrane, Thelonious Monk, Dave Koz, Peter White, Brenda Russell and Al Jarreau, just to name a few.

Caesar is a voting member of the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences and his album "Caesar Sings Nat "King" Cole was a stronger contender for a Grammy Nomination for the 57th Grammy Awards against: Tony Bennett and Lady Gaga, Johnny Mathis and Barbra Streisand. As a result he was the first Artist chosen by his peers (Grammy voting members) to perform Grammy weekend at the House of Blues – Sunset Strip, joined by Emilio Solla - Grammy Nominee. Caesar also performed with Paul Avgerinos - Grammy Award Winner.
